#### When Point of Pride began nearly ten years ago, we couldn't have imagined the reach and impact our work would have.

What started as a grassroots effort to support our trans siblings has grown into a national movement, driven by community care, mutual aid, and the unwavering belief that every trans person deserves access to the resources they need to thrive.

To date, we've dispatched more than 25,000 gender-affirming garments to trans youth and adults in all 50 states and 127 countries. We've awarded more than \$2.75 million in direct financial relief for gender-affirming care, including surgeries, HRT, and permanent hair removal services. These achievements would not have been possible without supporters like you stepping up and showing up for our community every single day.

As we reflect on all we've achieved together in 2024, we're proud of the ways we've adapted and expanded our care. This year, we launched Renewal Awards, providing additional financial assistance to recipients who need ongoing support. In June, we introduced the Thrive Fund, a groundbreaking program offering relief for a wide variety of needs, from fertility preservation to vocal training to fees associated with updating legal documents—all critical steps toward living authentically.

These new initiatives, combined with the addition of a dedicated Care Coordinator team member, mean that we're providing more personalized, hands-on support than ever before.

But 2024 has also been a year of deep challenge. The continued rising tide of anti-trans legislation across the country has created profound challenges for our community. This year's election results brought fear and despair for many of us who are already among the most marginalized in our country. The grief and pain are undeniable, but so too is the strength we inherit from our trans ancestors, who have shown us what resistance, community care, and collective action look like.

Through it all, one thing remains clear: in a world that often fails to support us, we find strength in supporting each other. This community is more than resilient—it is powerful, creative, and full of love. And with your continued support, we are creating a future where every trans person has the opportunity to live with dignity, authenticity, and joy.

To you, we offer our sincerest gratitude. Together, we've touched thousands of lives. Thank you for believing in Point of Pride and being an essential part of this work.



### "I see myself."

It's a moment that often brings tears of joy—the profound relief and euphoria of a reflection in the mirror that looks familiar and true. This is the reality for recipients of Point of Pride's Annual Trans Surgery Fund.

Gender-affirming surgery is more than vital, life-saving healthcare it's a turning point that unlocks a sense of confidence, safety, and fulfillment that cascades into every facet of life.

Our recipients tell us they're stepping into the world with a renewed sense of self—they're deepening relationships and strengthening connections with their communities

For so many, access to surgery means the ability to show up authentically and joyfully, whether in a classroom, workplace, or around a dinner table with loved ones.

When these medically necessary surgeries remain financially and logistically out of reach, compounded by systemic inequities and hostile legislation, this program is a lifeline: providing direct financial assistance to those who cannot afford this essential care.



# Transforming Lives Through HRT

Gender-affirming hormone therapy (HRT) is medically necessary, often life-saving, care. Yet it remains out of reach for many due to financial barriers, insurance exclusions, and a lack of accessible providers—issues compounded by rising anti-trans legislation.

This year, more than 15% of applicants to our HRT Access Fund came from Florida alone, underscoring the urgent need for support in states most at risk of healthcare restrictions.

Through partnerships with Plume, Folx, QueerMed, QueerDoc, TrueU, and Spectrum: The Other Clinic, we provided 117 recipients with comprehensive care, including telemedicine visits, lab work, prescription coverage, and more.

We are also proud to have partnered with the National Black Trans Advocacy Coalition (BTAC) to fund care specifically for 49 Black recipients, furthering our mission to ensure equitable access to this vital care.

For these recipients, HRT is more than healthcare—it's a pathway to authenticity, confidence, and the freedom to thrive.

### Pioneering Support for the Femme Community

Point of Pride's Electrolysis Support Program is the first and, to our knowledge, remains the only—program of its kind, providing direct financial aid for permanent hair removal services including electrolysis and laser.

For many in the trans community, this care is not just affirming-it's integral to their ability to safely traverse their everyday lives.

In 2024, we increased the grant award amount for the second year in a row, enabling recipients to access even more sessions of this lifechanging care.

The program is inclusive to folks of all genders, but guided by our founding principle of equity, it prioritizes trans women and femmes of color who often face heightened challenges.

### Holistic Community Support

In June 2024, Point of Pride launched the Thrive Fund, a groundbreaking program designed to meet the diverse and unique care needs of the trans community.

Each trans and gender diverse person travels a unique path. There is nuance and complexity to the support they will need that transcends the core medical care we often associate with transition —HRT and surgery.

The Thrive Fund supports a wide range of needs, including prosthetics or wigs, voice therapy, at-home IPL hair removal devices, fertility preservation, post-surgical caregiving, and more.

By addressing these oftenoverlooked aspects of transition, the fund helps recipients feel more confident, complete, and supported in their journey.

As a pilot program, the Thrive Fund offers an opportunity for us to be nimble and responsive, allowing us to adapt to meet our community's evolving needs. We look forward to building on this foundation in 2025.

### A note from our Director of Programs

In 2024, anti-trans legislation surged across the U.S., restricting everything from name and gender marker changes to bathroom access, sports participation, and even healthcare for both youth and adults. Even in states with legal protections, discrimination remained a persistent barrier—our application data showed a 77% increase in reported healthcare discrimination and a 57% increase in workplace discrimination. Simply put, our community has been under attack.

And yet, in a world that tells us we shouldn't rise, shouldn't grow, shouldn't live... somehow, we continue to find the resilience to dig deep and Thrive.

That's why we launched the Thrive Fund—a program designed to support our community in the many ways they define their own genderaffirming journeys.

From name and ID changes to vocal training, gender-affirming wigs, and prosthetics, the Thrive Fund provides microgrants to help trans folks navigate their transitions mentally, socially, and physically. Unlike our other programs, it was built to be flexible—to meet people where they are, recognizing that gender-affirming care isn't one-size-fits-all.

This unique structure has come with challenges, but it has also given us the opportunity to listen, learn, and innovate new ways to support our community.

We created the Thrive Fund because trans people deserve to flourish. And with your support, we keep finding new ways to help our community do just that.

### Extending Care Through Renewal Awards

In January 2024, Point of Pride launched Renewal Awards, a new initiative designed to extend support to past financial aid recipients.

Many recipients face financial and logistical challenges that make it difficult to maintain their care once their initial grant is exhausted.

Because HRT and permanent hair removal services are often ongoing types of care, these grants bridge the gap by providing crucial support to ensure continuity of care.

# Affirmation, One Garment at a Time

Chest binders and femme shapewear are simple yet essential tools for many trans people, offering comfort, confidence, and safety in daily life.

The need for this program has never been greater. This year, we received an average of 45 new garment requests every single day, reflecting the growing demand for these life-changing resources.

To meet this need, we expanded our partnerships with manufacturers and retailers and made significant investments in our infrastructure. This Fall, we added storage, inventory management software, and other tools, enabling us to ship hundreds more support packages each month to recipients in all 50 states and around the world.

The math is simple: one garment equals one life changed. In 2024, we were proud to celebrate the milestone of over 25.000 lives transformed.


#### Building Local Partnerships for Faster Access



#### Small Gestures, Outsized Impact

Affirming a trans person goes beyond medical care: it can be as simple as telling a trans person, "I see you, I support you, and you are not alone."

With every free garment we distribute, we always include a handwritten note. Sometimes it's a short message of support; other times, it's a deeply personal letter. Again and again, recipients tell us these notes have a profound and lasting impact, that these cards get taped inside school lockers or carried like treasures in their wallets.

For some, especially young people who might not be living in environments that support their identity, these are the first words of affirmation they've ever received. Knowing someone is on their side can make all the difference.

Beyond directly supporting recipients, Point of Pride builds connections through workplace letter-writing events with teams of all sizes and types. These gatherings not only foster a sense of community but also create space for meaningful conversations and education, inspiring allies to take action and deepen their understanding of trans topics and experiences.






### Inclusion in the Workplace

# Running with Pride


Point of Pride made history as six trans and gender-diverse athletes competed in the 2024 TCS New York City Marathon, the world's largest marathon.



Our athletes—Danne, Liz, Sprite, Exandra, Lyla, and Kae—demonstrated the perseverance, resilience, and determination that define both marathoners and the trans community. ### Building on Our Collective Power & Generosity

Another incredible \$2 million raised for trans healthcare.

Turning points often emerge from collective resilience and determination, and for our community, the Annual TikTok-a-Thon for Trans Health hosted by Mercury Stardust and Jory (AlluringSkull) has become a testament to both.

In 2023, this event raised an unprecedented \$2,000,000, transforming hundreds of lives. In 2024, Mercury and Jory once again rallied their platforms and supporters to build on this incredible success, demonstrating the enduring power of community.

This year was not without its challenges. On day 1 of the three-day, 30-hour fundraiser, TikTok banned Mercury Stardust's account after a barrage of false reports from transphobic trolls.

Jory, her co-host, also faced relentless bans across her accounts. These unjust actions sharply limited their ability to fundraise in real time, but Mercury and Jory responded with resilience and bravery, refusing to let hate silence their mission.

Even in the face of adversity, the

TikTok-a-Thon was filled with unforgettable moments of levity and connection. Point of Pride staff played Twister on the livestream, trans singer-songwriters filled the space with music, and guests joined to share stories of trans joy and triumph. We celebrated the profound impact of the money raised by holding up photos of recipients whose lives were transformed through access to healthcare, introducing them by name, and sharing their powerful stories with the world.

In the end, Mercury and Jory's unwavering determination prevailed, raising another incredible \$2,000,000 toward trans healthcare from 44,000+ generous donors. This moment, once again, reminds us of the collective love and strength that fuels our movement and the lasting difference we can make together.

# Showing Up with Purpose

In 2024, Point of Pride proudly showed up at events across the country, creating spaces for connection, education, and support.

At the Philadelphia Trans Wellness Conference, we led two community presentations: one focused on preparing physically and mentally for gender-affirming surgery, and the other centered on community care and ways to support ourselves and one another.

We participated in several LGBTQ+ Pride events, connecting with community members, sharing resources, amplifying our mission, and celebrating trans joy while providing tangible support to those who need it most.

Closer to home, we hosted volunteer events where supporters packaged and distributed hundreds of gender-affirming garments, delivering essential resources while fostering a spirit of collaboration and care.
